

609. DOCK PARTIES (cont).

If a Sergeant or any other N.C.O. gives an order to men to do a job and they do not do it the men will be instantly put under close arrest, and if in the Company Commander's opinion the men "refused" to work they will be sent for trial by Court Martial.

In future, O.C. this Unit will invite O.C. Docks Group to submit reports on the morning work, and if any report is unsatisfactory, the morning shift will be sent back to the Docks to assist the afternoon shifts.

Ships have to be turned round, and it is the duty of every man to pull his full weight.

610. PROFICIENCY PAY.

Considerable efforts were entailed to obtain proficiency pay for men of this Company.

It was granted on the grounds that the men were "efficient soldiers in every respect".

The Commanding Officer intends to review the whole question of proficiency pay.

If the Dock work proves to be unsatisfactory in future he will call upon Section Sergeants to submit reports on every soldier in their Sections.

Men who are marked "poor" workers will forfeit proficiency pay until such time as the Commanding Officer considers they are sufficiently efficient to be recommended for its restoration.

611. VENEREAL DISEASE.

ANY man suffering from venereal disease, or who suspects he is suffering from this disease, will report sick immediately.

Men who fail to comply with this order will be charged under Section 11 (Army Act).
